Aisyah is a filmmaker and aspiring director whose work centres on female-driven narratives rooted in emotion, identity and culture.

A graduate of Ngee Ann Polytechnic's Film, Sound & Video programme and a final year BA (Hons) Film student at LASALLE College of the Arts, she began her journey in editing and screenwriting before transitioning into directing.

Aisyah's thesis film *Tindakake Timbalku* blends horror with Javanese tradition and Srimpi dance, exploring themes of jealousy and legacy through an all-female cast. Her past works include *Housewives*, a documentary on stay-at-home mothers screened by HonourSG; *Kampungku*, about a mother-daughter conflict over a village home; and *Under Control*, an experimental portrait of a woman's anxious mind.

With a strong foundation in post-production, Aisyah approaches directing with attention to rhythm, tone and performance. Inspired by fantasy fiction and Southeast Asian cultures, she crafts emotionally resonant stories that explore womanhood and the quiet complexities of human connection.

Drawing from the heart of both a director and an editor, Ya Hui continues to craft narratives that transform raw footage into compelling stories that resonate with audiences.

Hajin is a director and creative strategist whose practice sits at the intersection of visual storytelling, sound and lived experience.

With a background in brand film production and marketing strategy within the advertising industry, his work navigates between structured communication and poetic ambiguity.

Hajin approaches filmmaking with a sensibility shaped by both commercial narratives and personal memory—often preferring images over explanations, and silence over resolution. His current focus lies in crafting hybrid forms that blur the boundary between documentary and fiction, with an emphasis on the sensory and the introspective.

Hajin is interested in building long-term creative systems that connect media, music and human presence across platforms, disciplines and borders.





DANIAL ZURYAN BIN YAKOB

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Major in Cinematography (Non-Fiction) and Editing (Non-Fiction)

Danial Zuryan Bin Yakob is a filmmaker, cinematographer and photographer whose work focuses on visual composition and creating aesthetically pleasing, thought-provoking images. Specialising in observational documentary filmmaking, he engages audiences with visuals that speak to both the eyes and the soul.

He is drawn to music-driven arts like street dance and music, while also exploring sociopolitical themes such as mental health, sexuality, and the struggles of marginalised communities.

Along with cinematography, Danial is a skilled editor, combining both crafts to create emotionally resonant, cohesive stories. His editing enhances the visual narrative, ensuring that the message connects with the audience.

Danial's short film *Protocol* (2024) has received 12 international film festival selections, winning Best Cinematography at the Wellington Film Festival, Athens International Art Film Festival and Lift-off Global Network. It was also a finalist at the Student Los Angeles Film Festival and Golden Bridge Istanbul Short Film Festival. He is currently refining his documentary work to blend impactful storytelling with compelling visuals.





FIRA ROSLAN

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Major in Production Design (Fiction) Minor in Sound (Non-Fiction)

Fira Roslan is a multidisciplinary creative, specialising in production design. With a background in film and a deep sensitivity to atmosphere and symbolism, her work often explores themes of identity, emotions and femininity, particularly within Southeast Asian narratives.

She is one of the production designers for *Tindakkake Timbalku*, a thesis film in which she translated abstract concepts such as abjection and the femme castratrice into a rich visual language of Javanese dance costume, space and accessories.

Her deep engagement with ritual aesthetics and symbolic texture contributed significantly to the film's eerie and immersive world-building.

In 2023, she took on the role of Wardrobe and Makeup Artist for the documentary experimentation *Al Audition: Lee Kuan Yew Project*, where she worked alongside her lecturer to craft historically grounded looks that intersected with speculative Al futures.

Her interdisciplinary approach, grounded research and sensitivity to emotional tone make her a unique asset to any creative production.

ChangSheng is a passionate cinematography practitioner with solid theoretical knowledge and hands-on experience in film and visual arts.

JP's thesis film *a voyage of eulogies* (2025) builds on his dissertation on Southeast Asian ecocinema. He also lensed thesis film *Bahay - Bahayan* (2025) on Super 8.

JP wrote and produced Sacred Cow (2024), which screened at the 54th Sehsüchte International Student Film Festival and clinched Best Cinematography at the 10th Singapore Youth Film Festival alongside multiple nominations. He also directed 10-0 (2023), a fiction film selected for the 22nd International Student Film and Video Festival at the Beijing Film Academy, as well as Beneath the Orchids (2023), a personal documentary nominated for Best Director and Best Cinematography at the 9th National Youth Film Awards.

JP is currently a participant in the Objectifs x Asian Film Archive Film Programmers' Lab, co-curating a short film programme titled Refuge Island as part of Singapore Shorts.





JENSIN ANG SIN YEE
